

**Domagoj Dorotić (tenor)** rođen je u Hrvatskoj 1979. godine. Glazbenu naobrazbu započinje kao trubač u Glazbenoj školi Ferdo Livadić u Samoboru, a srednju glazbenu školu završava na Glazbenom učilištu Elly Bašić 1999. godine. Nakon toga pohađa satove solo pjevanja, na nagovor brojnih profesionalnih glazbenika koji su uočili njegove vokalne potencijale. Potom polaže audiciju u Hrvatskom narodnom kazalištu, postaje njegovim članom i sudjeluje u brojnim projektima. Godine 2004. Postaje student solo pjevanja u klasi profesorice Vlatke Oršanić na Muzičkoj akademiji u Zagrebu, gdje diplomira 2008. godine i osvaja Rektorovu nagradu. Godine 2005. osvaja drugu nagradu na Regionalnom natjecanju učenika i studenata glazbe i plesa u Rijeci, a 2007. godine prvu nagradu na Državnom natjecanju učenika i studenata glazbe i plesa u Dubrovniku. Tijekom studija sudjeluje na brojnim međunarodnim pjevačkim natjecanjima kao što je Natjecanje Renata Tebaldi u San Marinu (2007.), gdje se plasira u polufinale. Godine 2008. na 17. Međunarodnoj ljetnoj akademiji Prag-Beč-Budimpešta pohađa majstorski tečaj Rotraud Hansmann i osvaja prvu nagradu za jednu od najboljih vokalnih interpretacija. Na Međunarodnom pjevačkom natjecanju u Schloss Laubachu (2008., Njemačka) osvaja prvu nagradu žirija, a 2009. godine Nagradu Hrvatskog glumišta u kategoriji izvanrednih dostignuća mladih opernih pjevača do 30 godina za ulogu Maxa u operi *Crux dissimulata* Srečka Bradića, u režiji Krešimira Dolenčića i produkciji Hrvatskog narodnog kazališta Zagreb i 25. Muzičkog biennala Zagreb, te za ulogu Fentona u Verdijevoj operi *Falstaff* u režiji Arnauda Bernarda i izvedbi Hrvatskog narodnog kazališta. Godine 2012. osvaja nagradu Ante Marušić za najbolje umjetničko ostvarenje u Hrvatskom narodnom kazalištu Split. Od sezone 2010./2011. Domagoj Dorotić djeluje kao solist Opere Hrvatskog narodnog kazališta u Zagrebu. Imao je čast pjevati hrvatsku himnu na svečanosti u povodu primanja Hrvatske u Europsku uniju 1. srpnja 2013. godine u Zagrebu.

**Domagoj Dorotić (tenor)** was born in Croatia, in 1979. He started his musical education as a trumpet player at the Ferdo Livadić Elementary Music School in Samobor (Croatia), and graduated in the trumpet from the Elly Bašić Music High School in Zagreb (Croatia) in 1999. Dorotić later decided to attend private solo-singing lessons because many professional musicians noticed his great vocal potentials. After that, he passed an audition at the Croatian National Theatre and as a member of its ensemble took part in numerous projects. In 2004, he began to study solo singing under Vlatka Oršanić at the Zagreb Academy of Music. In 2008, he graduated from this academy and won the University of Zagreb's Rector Award. In 2005, he won 2nd prize at the Regional Vocal Competition in Rijeka (Croatia), and in 2007 1st prize at the State Vocal Competition in Dubrovnik. During his studies, he took part in various international singing competitions including the Renata Tebaldi Competition in San Marino (2007), where he reached semi-finals. In 2008, at the 17th Prague-Vienna-Budapest International Summer Academy, Dorotić attended a master class conducted by Rotraud Hansmann, and won 1st prize for one of the best singing interpretations. In the International Singing Competition at Schloss Laubach (2008, Germany), he won 1st Jury Prize, and in 2009 the Croatian Theatre Award in the category Outstanding Accomplishments of Young Opera Singers up to 30 years of age for the role of Max in the *Crux Dissimulata* (by S. Bradic, directed by K. Dolenčić and produced by the Croatian National Theatre of Zagreb and the 25th Zagreb Music Biennale), and for the role of Fenton in *Falstaff* (by G. Verdi, directed by A. Bernard and performed by the Croatian National Theatre of Zagreb). In 2012, Dorotić won the Ante Marušić Award awarded by the Croatian National Theatre of Split. From the season 2010/2011, he has been engaged as a solo singer at the Opera of the Croatian National Theatre of Zagreb. Domagoj Dorotić had the honour of singing the Croatian national anthem at the official celebration of Croatia's joining the European Union on 1 July 2013 in Zagreb.
